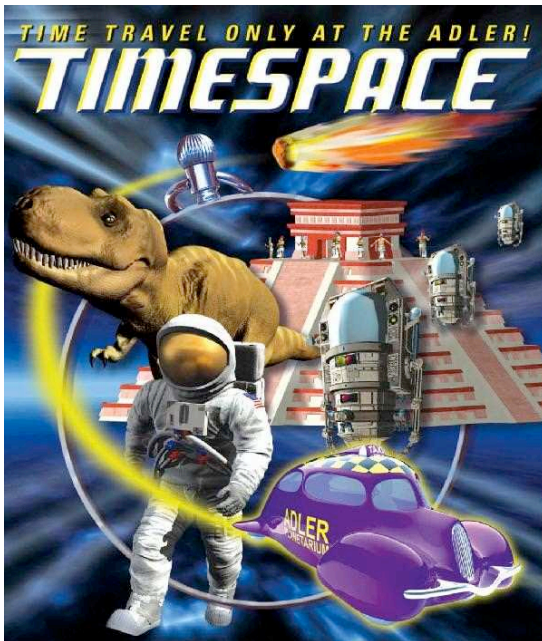

TO THE EDGE OF OUR SOLAR SYSTEM!

Travel to the edge of the solar system in the newest **TimeSpace** destination opening August 23. Immerse yourself in outerspace under a dome screen more than three stories high in the world's first all-digital theater. Follow the Interstellar Boundary Explorer – to be launched in 2008 – as the boundaries of our solar system are mapped for the first time. The mission continues as you visit a future research outpost in the year 2508.

Travel through time into the outer reaches of space without leaving Chicago's city limits in **TimeSpace!**

The first screening on August 23 will include a Q&A session with Dr. Dave McComas – IBEX Principal Investigator – and other IBEX mission team members.

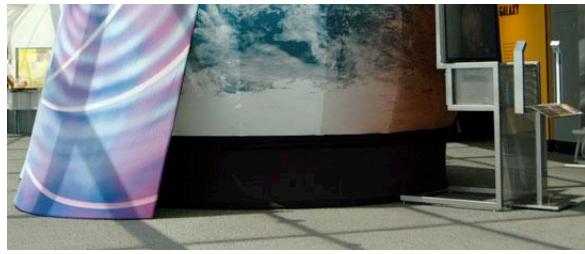

VISUALIZING THE FUTURE

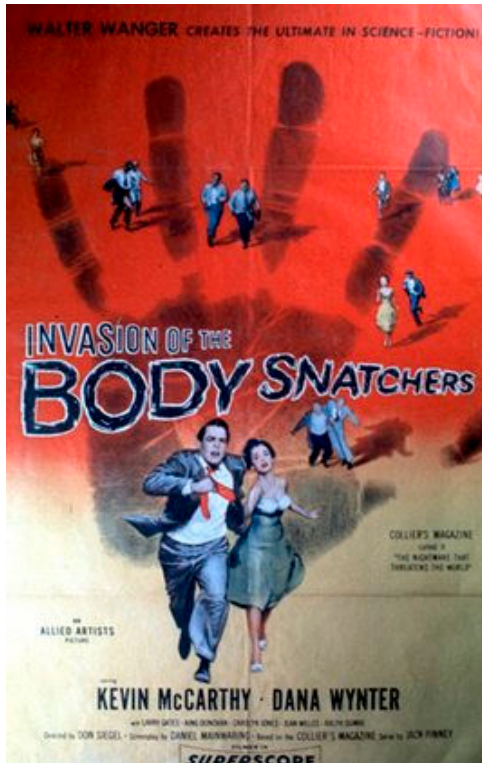
Take a stroll on Mars or play soccer with Moon rocks at slowed gravity levels on a state-of-the-art interactive floor in the new Vision For Space Exploration

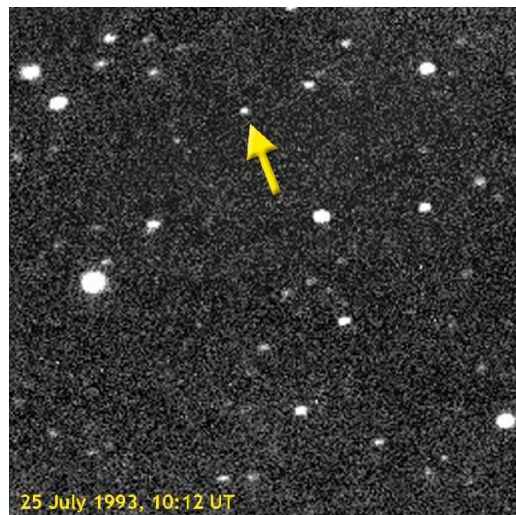
