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# POST RESERVATION CHECKLIST

We are so excited to welcome your group to the Adler Planetarium! Now that you've submitted your group reservation request, please follow the steps below to ensure that you're prepared prior to your visit.

# **Confirming Your Reservation**

- Please add schools@adlerplanetarium.
  org to your safe-senders list and check your spam filters if you have not received the confirmation notice email after five business days.
- If we are unable to accommodate your request, we will contact you to discuss alternative dates for your group.
- Please review your reservation for accuracy (especially arrival/departure times; sky shows; and lunch time) and make note of payment and cancellation policies.
- Sky shows and lunch space must be reserved ahead of your visit, and space is limited. Email to add these activities to your reservation.
- Now is a great time to confirm your transportation and begin recruiting chaperones using the chaperone requirements included on page 5 of this packet.

### Making Changes or Canceling Your Reservation

- Please contact us as soon as any change needs to be made to your reservation. Changes will be accommodated on a space-available basis.
- Changes to your visit must be submitted in writing by emailing <u>schools@</u> <u>adlerplanetarium.org</u>. Please include your Order Number in this email.
- If you need to cancel, you must do so in writing **21 days** or more prior to your visit date to receive a refund.
   Cancellations less than 14 days out are not eligible for a refund.
- If you bring more students, teachers, or adult chaperones than is indicated on your group confirmation, you will be charged full price admission and show fees for each additional person.
   All same-day admissions and show tickets are based on availability.
- If you bring fewer students, teachers, or adult chaperones than were paid for at the time of scheduling, you will not receive a refund.
- Groups may only reschedule three times before they must submit a new booking request. Rescheduling due to inclement weather/unplanned school closure/ museum closure do not count towards this number.



# FINAL PAYMENT

Payment is due in full two weeks prior to your visit. Once we receive your payment, we'll send you an email confirmation and receipt. At that point, your reservation is considered final. Payments can be made with credit card, check, or CPS purchase order.

# **Deposit Policy**

Schools that book 90 or more seats in a theater are required to pay a \$75 deposit to hold their reservation. The deposit is due two weeks after the booking confirmation has been sent or 3 weeks prior to the visit date whichever is soonest. If the trip is rescheduled more than 3 weeks prior to the visit date the deposit will be carried over to the new visit date. If it is less than three weeks prior to the visit date the deposit will not be refunded and a new deposit would be required for rescheduling.

# **Difficulty with Payment**

If you're having difficulty making your payment, please contact us prior to your payment due date by calling **(312) 294-0364**. We will do our best to work out an alternative arrangement; however, if we do not hear from you and payment is not received, your visit will be canceled.

# **SELECTING CHAPERONES**

To make the most of your visit and to help us create the best learning environment for all Adler Planetarium guests, we ask that you observe the following guidelines:

### Chaperones

Chaperones are adults **ages 21+** and are responsible for all students in your group and their behavior while visiting.

Chaperones are required to be with your students at all times during your visit, regardless of your students' grade level. Students and their chaperones must move through the museum together. Chaperones may not be stationery in "zones."

Chaperones are provided Adler branded chaperone stickers during orientation on the day of their trip. All adults in the group must wear these stickers somewhere visible on their person at all times while inside the building.

Unaccompanied students will be brought to the Accessible Entrance until their chaperones are located. Please see map on page 15 for Accessible Entrance location.

### **Chaperones Per Student**

#### Required:

- Pre-K 3rd grade: 1 chaperone for every seven students (1:7)
- 4th 12th grade: 1 chaperone for every ten students (1:10)

#### **Recommended:**

1 chaperone for every 5 students (1:5), regardless of grade level.

Teachers are included in the chaperoneto-student ratio. Chaperones will receive complimentary admission and shows with proper ratio if pre-registered with the group.

Additional chaperones exceeding a 1 chaperone to 5 students ratio will be charged full price.

Please inform us at the time of booking if you have 1:1 aides or other accessibility needs that require exceeding this ratio so we can make arrangements.

Reservations that do not meet these requirements will not be accepted.



We encourage you to print the last two pages of this guide and provide them to each chaperone.





# LUNCH OPTIONS

A lunch time will be assigned to your group based on your schedule. Food and drink are prohibited outside of the Cosmic Cafe.

Please note that lunches are limited to 20 minutes. It is important to arrive at the Cosmic Cafe 10 minutes before your scheduled lunch time. If you are late for lunch, we may not be able to extend or reschedule due to space limitations.

### **Lunch Option 1**

**BRING YOUR OWN** 

Place student lunches all together in boxes or coolers labeled with your school name prior to your arrival at the museum. Lunches that are boxed together are less likely to get lost or misplaced. When you arrive, we will collect your boxes or coolers and keep them in the lunchroom until your assigned lunchtime.

If it's a nice day, consider eating your bag lunches outside picnic-style in the park area around the museum. This gives you greater flexibility with your schedule and timing.

### Lunch Option 2 PRE-PURCHASE LUNCH FROM THE COSMIC CAFE

### Important

Only groups with lunch time reservations may use the cafe space. Please note if you do not book a lunch time there will be no space for your group to eat. These must be reserved prior to your visit. Pre-ordered lunches must be paid for in advance of your visit.

The Cosmic Cafe also offers a limited, school-group friendly menu on Field Trip Days, however, we cannot guarantee that the cafe can accommodate groups who do not prepurchase lunch before their visit. If your group plans to order lunch, please inform staff before visiting and arrive at the cafe well ahead of your scheduled time.

Before exiting, school groups must dispose of all trash, leaving the tables and floors clear.





Bus Arrival, Drop-Off, and Check-In

### **Be Prepared With**

- 1. A copy of your confirmation email for check-in
- 2. The exact count of students and chaperones (including teachers and aides) in your group
- 3. Additional payment (if needed)

Plan to arrive as close to your designated arrival time as possible to allow for orientation and check-in, and at least **45 minutes** before your first scheduled show or program.

If you are running late, please let us know as soon as possible by leaving a voicemail at **312-294-0364**.

School buses must drop off and pick up on the north side of the Adler, in the west-bound lane of Solidarity Drive. Look for our bus drop-off and pick-up loading zone signs.

Please be sure to print and share the **Group Pick-Up** and **Drop-Off Guide** (next two pages) with your bus drivers.

Upon arrival to the Adler, **please remain on your bus until an Adler staff member has greeted you and given directions for your visit.** If you are booked for a sky show, a packet of theater tickets will be provided to the group leader.

Your group will then be directed into the Adler. You will either enter through the Main Entrance, which is up a large flight of stairs, or the Accessible Entrance, which is a 550 foot walk from the bus drop off area.

You will be directed to store your coats and lunches as you enter, and can pick up content guides at this time. See page 10 for information about content guides.

Be sure to come back to this area to pick up your items before you depart.

If accessibility accommodations are needed and you did not make a note when making your reservation, please contact us at **schools@adlerplanetarium.org** prior to your visit so we can arrange accommodations.






# **GROUP DROP-OFF & PICK-UP**

The Adler Planetarium is located on the Chicago lakefront, just steps away from the **Field Museum** and the **John G. Shedd Aquarium**.

**Group drop-off/pick-up** is located on the west-bound lanes of Solidarity Drive, just west of the Adler. Buses should pull forward near the glass shelter, located on the north side.

The area directly in front of the Adler is a designated fire lane and stopping directly in front is **prohibited** by the Chicago Police Department, as is parking on the street in this area. Paid parking for cars is available at the meters and in the lot adjacent to the Adler.

All parking on Museum Campus is managed by Soldier Field. For more information visit **soldierfieldparking.com** or call **(312) 235.7701**.

# WELCOME!

**Welcome to Chicago's Museum Campus!** We are excited to host you and exceed your expectations for a fun, educational, and engaging experience. To make your trip go as smoothly as possible, we have a couple of guidelines about how to get to the Museum Campus, where to drop off your students, and where to park your bus.



Located on the beautiful shores of Lake Michigan, the Museum Campus is easily accessible via DuSable Lake Shore Drive. **We strongly recommend buses use the 18th Street** exit to minimize sharp turns and downtown traffic. Heading north along Special Olympics Drive will take you to the drop-off locations for all three institutions.

# DROP-OFF AND STAGING

All buses should use Solidarity Drive to reach their designated drop-off locations and for staging until drop-off locations are open.

- **Field Museum:** Bus drop-off is along the curb next to the East Lot.
- Shedd Aquarium: Bus drop-off is in the circle in front of the Aquarium.
- **Adler Planetarium:** Bus drop-off is on the north side of Solidarity immediately after making the turn past the Planetarium to head west.



Once you have dropped off your group, **please park buses in the 18th Street** turnaround just west of DuSable Lakeshore Drive, as illustrated on the back side of this document. This location is conveniently located within walking distance of all Museum Campus locations as well as the South Loop (via a pedestrian bridge).

There is free, but limited, parking for buses on Canal Street south of Roosevelt Road. Bus drivers must remain with the vehicle while parked at this location.

In support of our collective commitment to environmental conservation, we also discourage idling—instead, please come join us in the museums with complimentary admission!

# **Sky Show Tips**

Wondering which sky show to see? View trailers and descriptions on <u>our website</u>. and see the Field Trip Days schedule <u>here</u>. <u>Big Astronomy</u> is also available on Field Trip Days.

Seeing a sky show? It's important to understand that planetariums operate differently than movie theaters. Here are some tips to make your sky show experience stellar:

- Please arrive at the theater ten minutes before the scheduled time.
- Late arrivals for sky shows cannot be seated.
- Hold on to all sky show tickets for your group. Pass out tickets right before entering the theater. Every student and adult seeing a show must have a ticket.
- Your group should sit together. This makes space for other groups. Chaperones must sit with their assigned students.
- Food and drinks are not permitted in the theaters or anywhere outside of the Cafe
- To help the line move smoothly, chaperones should stand at the head of their group when entering a theater
- Photos or videos cannot be taken inside our theaters during a show
- For safety, stay seated while show is in progress.
- Due to safety guidelines, if you leave the theater during a show, you cannot be readmitted

- Be courteous of other visitors and remain quiet and respectful during the show.
- Groups asked to leave due to behavior will not be eligible for a refund




